Free parking in Randwyck!

You can park your car for free in Randwyck! UM has a large car park at Sorbonnelaan which offers free parking 24/7 to everyone with a UM Card.

If you no longer need your bicycle, then give it a second life...

Please let us know via verlorenofgevonden.nl and visit the Bike Depot at Gerardusweg 39. You can visit on Mondays between 1:00 PM and 5:00 PM and on Thursdays between 3:30 PM and 4:30 PM. Up to ten days after your visit to the depot, you can report the theft of your bicycle to the police on politie.nl/aangifte.

The opening hours are subject to change due to the coronavirus measures. Please make sure to call before you go to the Fietsbank or Bike Depot to check that they are open.

#posifiets



Get around quickly, cheaply and safely by bike

#1 posifiets is: parking your bike in a bike rack, bike shed or bike section in the inner city and Wyck

Why is this #posifiets?

You keep the pavement free for pedestrians and also for people with a walker, blind stick, mobility scooter or wheelchair.

Avoid a fine

Your bicycle can be removed. You will first receive a warning label attached to your bike. Then your bicycle is removed and you pay 25 euros to retrieve it from the Bike Depot at Gerardusweg 39.

#2 posifiets is: not leaving your bike in a bicycle rack, bicycle shed or bicycle section in the inner city and Wyck for more than 2 weeks in a row

Why is this #posifiets?

There will be enough parking space left for everyone who comes to the city centre and Wyck by bike.

Avoid a fine

If you park your bike longer than 2 weeks in a row, it may be removed. You pay 25 euros in administrative costs to retrieve it from the Bike Depot at Gerardusweg 39.

#3 posifiets is: walking through the shopping area with your bike in hand

Why is this #posifiets?

This is how you keep shopping fun for everyone. Shoppers don't have to be on the lookout constantly for cyclists racing past.

Avoid a fine

You risk a fine of 60 euros + 9 euros administration costs.

#4 Positive cycling is: keeping your phone in your pocket

Why is this #posifiets?

Talking, messaging or navigating on your bike is dangerous, both for yourself and for other road users. Keep it safe, do it #posifiets.

Avoid a fine

You risk a fine of 100 euros + 9 euros administration costs.


Unsupervised and uncovered bicycle racks



In the green marked areas you may park your bike or moped for a maximum of 2 consecutive weeks in the designated bike section, bike rack or bike shed.



Cycling through the pedestrianized shopping area during shop opening hours is not allowed. If you do so, you risk being fined.



And if you really cannot find a parking spot for your bike?

All racks and parking spaces full? This is how you park your bike #posifiets:

- choose a safe spot
- outside the car-free shopping area of the city centre
- keep at least one metre of the pavement free
- do not block a fire escape

Combining public transport and cycling

Maastricht is easily by public transport from throughout the Euregio Meuse-Rhine. As a student in the Netherlands, you can travel to and from your institute free of charge or at a discount when using public transport. For more information, visit: duo.nl.

Switching between public transport and the bike

When you get off the bus or train and want quickly continue your onward journey, you can use a shared bicycle. Maastricht has two bicycle-sharing systems:

- You can continue your journey on a public transport bike (OV-fiets), which can be rented at Maastricht railway station for a small daily fee. For more information, visit: ns.nl/en/door-to-door/ov-fiets
- You can also use the Arriva Shared Bicycle with the Hello-Bike app. The user pays for the duration of their use of the bike. For more information, visit: maastrichtbereikbaar.nl/en/students

Travelling by a P+R

You can park your car free of charge at P+R Noord in suburbs of Maastricht if you continue your journey to the city centre by bus. Arriva's bus line 10 and 30 will take you every 15 minutes for only € 2,20 p.p. to the heart of the city and back again.
